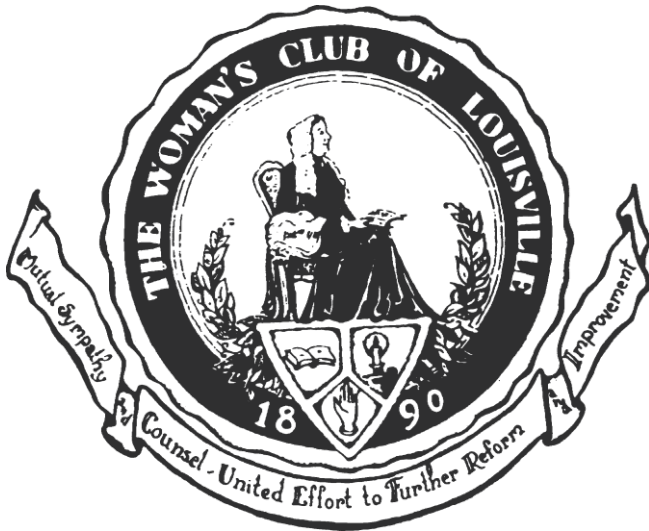

A Committee from *The Bulletin* staff consisting of Mrs. Herbert Miller, Mrs. Elliot Maddox, Mrs. David Musselman, Mrs. T. Gill Richards and Mrs. John Laffan, Jr. were asked to judge the unsigned drawings. It was a unanimous decision of the group that the drawing below by Ruth Wilson Cogshall be adopted as the seal of The Woman's Club of Louisville.



This seal shows the figure of a woman representing our Founders. The sketch was made from the portrait of Mrs. B.F. Avery which hangs in our library.

The shield is divided into three sections, each one depicting a qualification for membership.

- Open Book... Intelligence
- Candle (lighted)... Character
- Open Hand... Reciprocity

The ribbon bears the inscription which embodies the object of the Club as set for in Article 4. "Mutual sympathy and counsel and united effort to further reform and improvement."

The laurel leaves are for the fame already gained through work. The wreath is not completed. This indicated that our work is not completed.

MISSION

The Woman's Club of Louisville was organized for the purpose of: promoting and supporting civic improvements; championing the educational and philanthropic needs of our community – especially for women and children; and cultivating the fine arts.

HISTORY

The Woman's Club of Louisville was organized March 1, 1890, at the home of Mrs. B.F. Avery, who lived at Fourth and Broadway, the site of the Heyburn Building. There were thirty-nine charter members.

The first Clubhouse at 1212 South Fourth Street burned on December 12, 1917. The Committee House, 1322 South Fourth Street, was the next home until September 1923, when the construction of the present Clubhouse was completed. The last bonds were burned on May 5, 1954.

From the nucleus of thirty-nine members, The Woman's Club rapidly expanded in size and interests. Its chief concern was civic betterment, but cultural pursuits were not neglected.

The Club sponsored book groups, concerts, and exhibitions of art. It promoted studies of government. With great zeal, the club attempted to better the conditions of women and children. It supported better housing, better education, and improved nutrition.

The membership decided that the aims of this new Club should be to uplift the moral tone of the community and to instill virtue in community life. The Woman's Club started out on a high plane. It united in its efforts to improve and reform the city.

The Club succeeded in getting women elected to the Board of Education and appointed to boards of industrial schools, the Blind Asylum, and the Home for the Aged and the Infirm.

In 1906, the Carnegie Institute declared The Woman's Club of Louisville to be the "greatest ethical influence for public sentiment in the state of Kentucky." The Club was purported to be the most influential group of women in the city. It was formidable in its approach when it attempted to find solutions to problems of discrimination and inequality.

CLUB POLICIES BOARD MEETINGS

1. The Board of Directors shall meet monthly on a Monday at 10:00 a.m., with the date to be determined by the President.
2. Deliberations of the Board shall be confidential.

COMMITTEE PROJECTS

3. Dates of all morning, special, or committee meetings shall be cleared on the calendar before requesting approval by the Board. Following Board approval the dates of the meetings are to be placed on the calendar. No more than one committee meeting shall be held on any given day.
4. Guests of the Club may be invited to committee programs with special permission of the committee chair.

5. Committee projects shall be approved by the Board. Disbursal of profits from committee projects shall be approved by the Board. All payments for sales or events are to be directed to the office, payable to The Woman's Club of Louisville or The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund for the purpose stated or indicated. All payments for expenses shall be made by the Club office.
6. All overnight trips shall be approved through the Travel Chair of the Council on Finance and approved by the Council on Finance and the Board of Directors. *Hold Harmless* forms are required for all trips and are to be kept at the Club office. Medical information forms shall be completed by each traveler and be held by the accompanying organizer on the trip.
7. All activities, events, or programs must be approved by the Board.
8. Solicitation of *The Bulletin* advertisers for Club events or Charity events shall be cleared by the Chair of Publications and the Board of Directors.
9. All fund-raising activities on behalf of The Woman's Club of Louisville must have approval of the Board of Directors.
10. All information or statements to the media or contact with the media must first be approved by the President.

CLUB CLOSING DATES AND HOURS

11. The Club is closed on the following days:
Martin Luther King Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and the Friday following, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Oaks Day, Memorial Day and Independence Day. If a holiday falls on Saturday, Friday will be observed as the holiday. When JCPS closes due to bad weather, any Club planned activities or meetings for that day are cancelled. If JCPS delays school, then the Club is open and if JCPS closes on WCL's election day, the election will take place.
12. Club hours are: 9:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

CLUB RENTAL

13. Guidelines and rental rates have been adopted regarding the rental of the Clubhouse and the Frazier House. Inquiries should be made to the Rental Chair or Secretary in the office.
14. No member of the staff is to serve any alcoholic beverages.
15. The facilities of The Woman's Club may not be rented for any political purposes.
16. The Woman's Club does not give rent-free use of the auditorium or other rental facilities to any organization.

COMMUNITY REPRESENTATIVES

17. The President shall appoint annually, subject to confirmation by the Board, representatives to community organizations to which the Board has authorized representation.
18. No Community Representative shall vote to involve The Woman's Club in any issues, political or otherwise, in community activities. If such an issue arises that will require her vote, she shall request and follow the recommendations of the Board in the matter.

19. A report of the Heuser Hearing & Language Academy shall be made at the annual Business Meeting.
20. Any Club representative to outside organizations will report to the WCL Board as needed or at the President's discretion.

CONCERT GRAND PIANO

21. Use of the concert grand piano shall be governed by guidelines adopted by the Board of Directors. Inquiries about its use should be made through the chair of the Music Committee or the president.

HOUSE RULES

22. Notices on the bulletin board will be limited to activities of The Woman's Club and to organizations in the community to which the Club sends representatives.
23. No member is to ask the Clubhouse staff to do jobs for her or for her committee without clearance from the President. Vendors and renters are responsible for their set ups and take downs.
24. Members must consult with the Beautification Committee or the President before decorating the interior of the Clubhouse, Frazier House, or Carriage House.
25. All items and decorations brought into the Club must be approved by the Housekeeping chair and the Committee on Beautification, or the President.
26. Offers of gifts shall be submitted to the President. If approved by her and the Beautification Committee, the gifts shall be reported to the Board by the President for acceptance.
27. Furniture and accessories are not to be moved without approval of the Beautification Committee or the President.
28. The Woman's Club is not responsible for insurance on items brought onto the properties.
29. Furniture or equipment of The Woman's Club may not be borrowed or rented and shall remain in the Clubhouse, Frazier House, or Carriage House unless special permission is granted by the President.
30. The parlor and library shall remain open on Club meeting days.
31. A member may reserve up to four tables for cards in the Clubhouse or Frazier House by making arrangements with the office. It will be without charge if no extra work for the staff or any expense is incurred. The premises are to be left as they were found.
32. No pets will be allowed in the Clubhouse or Frazier House unless permission is granted by the Board.
33. Announcements, distribution of brochures, or sales which promote an outside entity are prohibited.

LUNCHEONS

34. Reservations for Wednesday luncheons must be made prior to 12:00 noon on the Monday preceding each luncheon and may be made up to four weeks in advance.
Standing reservations may be made in the office. Standing reservations do not hold for selected events. Cancellations for each luncheon must be made

- prior to 12:00 noon on the Monday preceding the luncheon. It is the responsibility of members with or without standing reservations to cancel their own reservations, or they will be billed.
35. If a member calls for a reservation after the deadline of 12:00 noon Monday or after the capacity has been reached, she may request that her name be placed on the waiting list. In this event, it is the responsibility of the member to call the office later to check on her reservation status. Any member from the waiting list given a reservation will be billed if she fails to attend the luncheon. If a luncheon reservation is cancelled after the deadline, the member will be billed; and payment will be expected within 10 days.
 36. When a member pays for her luncheon, she must pay for all the reservations in her name. A nonmember may attend four Wednesday luncheons per Club year. Members' spouses and caregivers are not included in this restriction. The guest's luncheon must be paid for by a Club member.
 37. Reservations for Committee tables and reservations for separate tables must be made for a minimum of four persons. Committee tables will be reserved for any number, with a minimum of four.
 38. Members who wish single reservations and are not sitting at a Special or Commit-tee table will be accommodated at Hospitality tables.
 39. A member must check with the Hospitality Chairman for any groups over twenty, and no group should exceed thirty in number without special permission.
 40. The content of the blessing given before the luncheon on Wednesday should be at the discretion of the person saying the prayer.

MEMBERSHIP

41. The procedure for proposing members is explained in the Bylaws, Article VI, Sec. 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.
42. (a) A new member shall attend one orientation meeting during her first year.
(b) A new member is required to attend one Business Meeting (May or September) during her first year.
(c) A new member who joins The Woman's Club in the months of June through March shall serve on the Committee on Hospitality during her first Club year. A new member who joins The Woman's Club in April or May shall serve on the Committee on Hospitality the following year. After the year of mandatory service on the Committee on Hospitality, a member who chooses to remain on that committee must indicate that choice on the committee selection form or the member's name will be removed from the committee roster.
43. Names of members from The Younger Woman's Club in good standing will be presented to The Woman's Club, on or before June 1, of each year. These names first go to the Committee on Membership of The Woman's Club, then are given to the Board of The Woman's Club for approval.
44. Candidates proposed for membership who are not passed by the Committee on Membership are not to be brought before the Board unless the proposer insists.

45. All applications for Associate Membership must be approved by the Board. Employment, health, and financial reasons are the first considerations for granting Associate Membership. If the number of applications for Associate Membership exceeds the number of vacancies, the Board may vote to place the remaining applicants meeting qualifications on a waiting list to fill vacancies occurring in that category before the end of that fiscal year.
46. Names of new "Golden Girls" are announced each year at the Birthday Luncheon according to the year, rather than by month and year.
47. An Honorary Member shall be elected at the Annual Meeting upon recommendation of the Board.
48. A newly-elected member who moves her permanent residence out of town within the first thirty days shall have her initiation fee and dues refunded upon request.
49. To avoid confusion, individuals who are listed in the *Yearbook* as being nonresident members shall use their out-of-town addresses for the *Yearbook*.

PROGRAMS

50. All programs are open to nonmember guests, except the two business meetings.
51. In order to meet the Internal Revenue Service requirement for tax exempt status, the Club shall be open to the general public three times a year.
52. Persons arriving late or leaving early for a program are requested to sit in the rear of the auditorium. No one will be seated at a music performance until the conclusion of a musical number.
53. All proceeds from programs related sales of items offered for immediate purchase or order shall be made payable to: The Woman's Club of Louisville. All contracts for programs shall reflect this procedure.
54. All monies given to any charity, including The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund, shall be subject to the Operations fee of 10% applied to the gross income.

PURCHASING

55. All purchases shall be made from advertisers in *The Bulletin*, whenever possible.

DRIVEWAY

56. Vehicles shall be prohibited from using the driveway between the Clubhouse and Frazier House unless permission is granted.

YEARBOOK

57. The *Yearbook* is published solely for the personal use of the WCL membership and shall not be used for any non-Club business or solicitation. Any changes to the *Yearbook* must be approved by the Board of Directors.

FINANCIALS

58. Funds named for an individual shall remain listed on the Financial Statements in perpetuity. The fund shall never be taken to a zero balance, allowing the gift to be recognized.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
of
The Woman's Club of Louisville

We, Patty B. Semple, Antoinette D. Smith, Annie J. Gamble, Jennie T. Brandeis, Kate S. Avery, Minnie V. Hartwell, for ourselves, associates and successors, do hereby unite for the purpose of forming a corporation having no capital stock, under the provisions of Chapter 32 of the Kentucky Statutes, and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

Art. 1. The name of the corporation shall be The Woman's Club of Louisville.

Art. 2. The place in which the principal office of the corporation is to be located is Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky.

Art. 3. The object of the corporation shall be mutual sympathy and counsel, and united effort to further reform and improvement in the community in which we live.

Art. 4. The corporation may acquire by purchase or otherwise, and hold, maintain and manage such property as may be necessary or convenient. For the purpose of determining the members of the corporation who shall be entitled to participate in the proceeds of any sale of the real estate and improvements thereon used as a Club building, or any other property used as a Club building in which the proceeds of the sale of the Club building may have been reinvested, it may issue certificates of interest in said property, provided no dividend shall ever be paid on said certificates. Said certificates shall contain such other conditions as the corporation may deem necessary; shall be registered upon books of the corporation and shall not be transferable except as between the owners thereof and between the owner and a member of the corporation. In case of the death of a certificate- holder or her ceasing to be a member of the corporation, all of her interest in the assets of the Club shall cease, and her certificate shall be canceled. Provided further that the personal representative of such deceased certificate-holder, or such certificate-holder ceasing to be a member of the Club, may, within 90 days after either of the foregoing contingencies, transfer any such certificate to any member of the corporation.

Art. 5. The executive authority of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors to be composed of its officers. The Board of Directors shall have the right to fill all vacancies in the body occurring after election, even though the officer may not yet have assumed the active discharge of her duty; and a vacancy shall be considered such, whether occasioned by declination, resignation, death, removal from the city of Louisville and county of Jefferson, or a disability which, in the judgement of the Board is of so long continued a character as to require the place to be filled anew.

Art. 6. The officers of the corporation shall be a president, one or more vice presidents, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, a treasurer, and the chairmen of such official committees as the corporation may create from time to time. The officers shall be elected in such manner and at such time as may be provided in the Bylaws.

Art. 7. The Bylaws of the corporation shall be prescribed by the members. When once adopted, they shall not be suspended, except in the manner provided in said Bylaws.

Art. 8. The corporation shall begin its life upon the filing of these articles as prescribed by law and shall continue for fifty years, unless sooner dissolved by its members.

Art. 9. The corporation shall not incur a greater indebtedness than two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000.00). Such indebtedness may be secured in such manner as the Board of Directors may determine, including a mortgage upon the property of the corporation under such terms as may be prescribed by the said Board of Directors.

Art. 10. The private property of the members shall not be subject to the payment of the debts of this corporation.

AMENDED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

That pursuant to Kentucky Revised Statutes 273.260, a majority of the members being present and voting at a meeting of The Woman's Club of Louisville, due notice of the specific purpose having been given, it was moved, seconded, and duly carried that Article VIII of the Articles of Incorporation be amended so that it shall read as follows:

Article VIII

The corporation shall continue in business perpetually unless sooner dissolved as provided by law.

BYLAWS
of
The Woman's Club of Louisville
Incorporated

ARTICLE I
NAME AND OBJECTS

- Name Sec. 1. The name of the Club shall be The Woman's Club of Louisville.
- Objects Sec. 2. Its objects shall be those laid down in Article 3 of the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE II
MANAGEMENT

- Board of Directors Sec. 1. The affairs of the Woman's Club shall be administered by a Board of Directors composed of a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Third Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, the Chairman of the Council on Finance, the Editor of *The Bulletin*, and the Chairmen of the Committees on American and Foreign Affairs, Art, Community Service, Culinary Arts, Drama, Gardens, Health, Hospitality, Literature, Music, Nominations and Elections, Publications, Special Interests and Ways and Means.
- Sec. 2. The Board shall transact the business of the Club, having a general power in this respect subject to the control of the Club.
- Sec. 3. The Board shall have the power to create such committees as become necessary to promote the welfare of the Club and shall become further empowered to decide if the chairmen of such committees may serve on the Board of Directors.
- Sec. 4. The Board shall have the power to fill any vacancy occurring in its membership until the unexpired term has been completed.
- Sec. 5. No member appointed by the Board to fill out an unexpired term of more than one year shall be eligible to succeed herself in the same office except the Chairman of the Committee on Publications and the Editor of *The Bulletin*.
- Sec. 6. No member may serve on the Board for more than six consecutive years, except as Editor of *The Bulletin*.
- Sec. 7. No member of the Board except the Chairman of the Committee on Publications, the Editor of *The Bulletin*, and the Treasurer shall be eligible to succeed herself. The Treasurer shall be limited to two consecutive terms.
- Sec. 8. The Board may, at any regular or called meeting, request the resignation of any member whose membership it does not regard as desirable, without stating any reason for its action. Three negative votes shall be sufficient to defeat such action. If the resignation of the member in question be not received within thirty days, the Board shall drop her name from the list of members.
- Sec. 9. The President, Vice Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurer, and the Chairman of the Council on Finance shall constitute an Executive Committee to act on questions arising between Board meetings which do not affect the

general policy of the Club.

The Executive Committee shall employ the office staff and the staff of Club assistants. All hiring must be approved by the Council on Finance at its next meeting.

The Executive Committee shall appoint a caterer for the luncheons. Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee shall appoint the Chairman of the Committee on Publications before January first of the odd years. The term of office shall be for two years.

Subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, together with the Chairman of the Committee on Publications, shall appoint the Editor of *The Bulletin*, the Editor of the *Yearbook*, and the Advertising Manager of *The Bulletin*.

The appointment of the Editor of *The Bulletin* shall be confirmed by the Board at its February meeting in the even calendar years. The appointment of the Editor of the *Yearbook* shall be confirmed by the Board at its February meeting in the odd calendar years. The appointment of the Advertising Manager shall be confirmed by the Board at its February meeting in the odd years. The term of office shall begin at the close of the Annual Meeting and shall be two years.

Sec. 10. No member shall be eligible for appointment to office of chairmanship who shall not have been an active member of the Club for one year on the date she shall assume office.

Sec. 11. A period of twelve (12) months shall elapse before a member who has completed her years of eligibility on the Board may serve as a member of the Board again.

Sec. 12. All deliberations of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee shall be confidential.

ARTICLE III
DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Sec. 1. The President shall preside at all official meetings of the Club and of the Board of Directors. She shall have general supervision of the interests of the Club and shall perform such other duties as are incident to the office. She shall appoint a Committee on Membership (see Article IV, Sec. 6) and such standing and special committees as are not otherwise provided for.

The President shall appoint the Parliamentarian subject to confirmation by the Board.

She shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees except the Committee on Nominations and Elections and the Committee on Membership.

She shall have all the privileges of membership on the Committees except the right to nominate and to vote. The President shall inform her successor immediately following the election that she is entitled to attend, with non-voting privileges, all Board, Executive Committee, and Charity Fund Meetings.

Sec. 2. The First, Second and Third Vice Presidents, in this order, shall perform the duties of the President in her absence.

Executive

President

The First Vice President, together with the chairman of committees, shall arrange the programs of the Club. She shall be responsible for executing the contracts for all programs.

The Second Vice President shall release all publicity for the Club to the various news media. She shall be the administrator of all Social Media.

Vice
Presidents

The Third Vice President shall be in charge of the welcoming and orientation of new members. She shall ascertain from each member of the Club her preference as to committee affiliations and shall report this information to the proper chairman.

Sec. 3. The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Club and of the Board of Directors and shall perform such other duties as are incident to the office. It shall be her duty to notify the members of the Board of all Board meetings.

Recording

Sec. 4. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the general correspondence of the Club. She shall keep a record of all official communications sent out or received by her. She shall notify all persons of election to membership. She shall notify the member proposing a candidate for membership as to the election or rejection of her candidate.

Corresponding

Sec. 5. The Treasurer shall have general supervision of all money coming to the Club, which money shall be deposited in the name of the Club in such bank as the Council on Finance may select, the Board of Directors concurring. All bills less than \$500.00 shall be paid by check signed by one of the following: the Treasurer, the Chairman of the Council on Finance, or the President. All bills of \$500.00 or more shall be paid by check signed by two of the following: the Treasurer, the Chairman of the Council on Finance, or the President.

Treasurer

The Treasurer, the Chairman of the Council on Finance, the President, and the Finance personnel shall be required to give bond in such sum as the Council on Finance shall decide, the Board of Directors concurring. The bonds shall be executed by a responsible guaranty company, and the expense shall be defrayed by the Club.

All contracts of The Woman's Club, including those also signed by other designated individuals (Article III, Sec. 2, Paragraph 2, and Article IV, Sec. 5, Paragraph 2 and Paragraph 4), shall be signed by the President and one of the other bonded officers.

The Treasurer shall make a monthly report to the Council on Finance and to the Board of Directors. She shall make a report to the Club at each regular business meeting.

The Finance Personnel shall keep a correct account of all money received and paid out, and her books shall be open to the inspection of the Board of Directors and the members of the Council on Finance.

The Treasurer or the Chairman of the Council on Finance shall be empowered to act for The Woman's Club of Louisville in all transactions pertaining to the buying and selling of stocks, bonds, and other securities, provided that the special transaction has been duly authorized by the Council on Finance, the Board of Directors concurring. The signing of proxies shall also be the duty of either of these officers, the Board of Directors concurring.

Sec. 6. The Parliamentarian shall attend the Board and business meetings. She shall act in advisory capacity to the President. As Parliamentarian, she would have no vote at the meetings.

ARTICLE IV

DUTIES OF COMMITTEES AND COUNCIL ON FINANCE

Sec. 1. The Club shall work under the direction of the committees named in Article II. A member may serve on three committees in addition to the Committee on Hospitality. Members have until August 1 to change committees in order to be included in the Yearbook. However, in order to vote in summer business meetings and committee elections, a member must have declared membership by May 1.

Sec. 2. The Program Committee shall be composed of the Chairmen of the Committees on American and Foreign Affairs, Art, Community Service, Culinary Arts, Drama, Gardens, Health, Hospitality, Literature, Music, and Special Interests. It shall plan the regular program meetings of the Club, for which it shall be allocated a sum of money each year by the Council on Finance, the Board of Directors concurring.

Program Committee

Sec. 3. The Council on Finance shall be composed of the President, the First Vice President, the Treasurer, the Chairman of the Council on Finance, the Chairman of Hospitality, the Chairman of Publications, the Advertising Manager of *The Bulletin*, past Presidents, past Treasurers, and past Chairmen of the Council on Finance. Additional members may be appointed by the Chairman of the Council on Finance, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors.

Council on Finance

The Council on Finance shall have charge of financial affairs of the Club except those which fall under the jurisdiction of the Board of Directors. No unbudgeted expenditure of \$500.00 or more may be made without approval of the Board of Directors. No other unbudgeted expenditure shall be made by the Board of Directors without conference with the Council on Finance.

The Council on Finance shall submit to the Board of Directors a preliminary draft of the proposed annual budget for review and recommendations before submitting the proposed budget for adoption by the Board.

A certified public accountant shall be selected by the Council on Finance, the Board of Directors concurring, to review the books of the Club annually. The report of same shall be submitted to the Club at the first regular business meeting.

Sec. 4. The Committee on Hospitality shall be responsible for all hospitality of the Club.

Hospitality

Sec. 5. The Committee on Publications shall be responsible for all official publications issued by the Club. It shall be composed of the Chairman of Publications, the Editor of *The Bulletin*, the Editor of the *Yearbook*, and the Advertising Manager of *The Bulletin*.

Publications

The Chairman of Publications shall be appointed before January first of the odd calendar years. She shall be responsible for contracts for printing the *Yearbook* and *The Bulletin*. She shall appoint any assistants needed. She shall compile the Summer Calendar. She shall be a member of the Board of Directors and of the Council on Finance.

The Editor of *The Bulletin*, which is one of the official publications of the Club, shall be appointed in the even calendar years. She shall be responsible for the editorial content and for the printing of *The Bulletin*. She shall appoint the editorial staff. She shall be a member of the Board of Directors.

The Editor of the *Yearbook* shall be appointed in the odd calendar years. It shall be her duty to edit the *Yearbook* of the Club.

The Advertising Manager of *The Bulletin* shall be appointed in the odd calendar years. She shall be responsible for all advertising contracts. She shall appoint assistants as needed. She shall be a member of the Council on Finance.

Committee on Membership

Sec. 6. An Advisory Committee on Membership consisting of five persons shall be appointed by the President and known only to her. The Committee shall receive all proposals for membership and shall report thereon to the Board of Directors in writing, through the President. It is imperative that the President and Committee members keep all recommendations confidential. This Committee may also present candidates of its own selection with recommendations.

ARTICLE V
DUTIES OF CHAIRMEN

Sec. 1. Each chairman of an official committee may appoint from her committee a vice chairman, a secretary, and any other assistants as she may deem necessary. She shall plan the work of her committee for the ensuing year.

Sec. 2. Each chairman shall assist in arranging the programs of the Club. She shall conduct meetings of which her committee is in charge.

Sec. 3. At each meeting of the Board of Directors, each chairman shall be ready to report the work of her committee. At the Annual Meeting she shall present a written report of the work accomplished during the year.

Sec. 4. The Chairman of the Council on Finance shall, with her Council, conduct the financial affairs of the Club, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. She shall make a monthly report to the Board of Directors and present a report to the Club at each regular business meeting.

ARTICLE VI
MEMBERSHIP

Classes

Sec. 1. Membership in The Woman's Club shall consist of six classes: (a) Active; (b) Associate; (c) Nonresident; (d) Special; (e) Honorary; and, (f) Fifty-Year.

Active

Active membership shall be limited to one thousand.

Associate

Associate membership shall be open to those who have had Active membership for fifteen years or more but who now find it impossible to participate actively in Club activities. Those members wishing to qualify may apply to the President for action by the Board of Directors. Application must be made in writing to the Board of Directors. Associate members shall be entitled to all the privileges of membership except the right to vote, hold office, propose or endorse candidates for

membership, or represent the Club officially.

Any Associate member who wishes to resume Active membership may do so by letter of application to the Board of Directors. Her name shall then be placed at the top of the Waiting List. Associate membership shall be limited to one hundred.

Nonresident membership shall be open to those members whose voting residence is more than fifty miles from Louisville. Nonresident members shall be entitled to all the privileges of the Club except the right to vote, hold office, propose or endorse candidates for membership, serve on any committees, or represent the Club officially. Active or Associate members may be eligible to transfer to Nonresident classification. Any Nonresident member who returns to live within a fifty-mile radius of Louisville must forthwith submit her application to return to Active status. Any member who is a nonresident and who chooses to have all the privileges of Active membership shall pay full Active dues and retain her Active status.

Special membership shall be open to those members who are disabled to the extent that they are incapable of attending Club meetings or participating in Club activities but who wish to retain Club membership. Any request for such membership shall be submitted in writing to the Board of Directors. Members granted such membership shall have the privileges of membership except the right to attend meetings, vote, hold office, propose or endorse candidates for membership, serve on committees, or represent the Club officially.

Honorary membership is the highest honor the Club can bestow on one of its members. Accordingly, the standards for earning such an honor are understandably high. Honorary membership may be conferred by the Club on recommendation of the Board of Directors in recognition of distinguished service. Any member may present a candidate to the Board of Directors for consideration. To be eligible the candidate must have been a member of the Club for at least ten years. She must have demonstrated leadership in several areas of the Club and promoted the mission of the Club. Recommended guidelines for proposal approved by the Board of Directors are available in the Club office.

Nominations for Honorary Membership must be submitted in writing to the President no later than March 1 of the current year. If a woman or women are nominated, the nomination letter will be read at the March Board of Directors meeting and will be voted on by ballot at the April Board meeting. The Board *may* recommend one candidate per year to be considered by the Club for bestowing the award of Honorary Member. Three negative votes at the Board of Directors' meeting shall defeat the nomination. The Club shall confer the recognition during the May Business meeting. Three negative votes at the Club Business meeting will defeat the nomination. The Honorary Member will be entitled to all the privileges of membership, except the right to hold elective office, and she will be exempt from paying annual dues going forward.

Nonresident

Special

Honorary

Fifty-Year membership shall include those members who have been members of the Club for fifty years. They shall continue to have the privileges of membership of the class of membership to which they belong when they become Fifty-Year members. They shall be exempt from the payment of dues.

Waiting List A Waiting List member, who has paid her initiation fee, shall have all the privileges of The Woman's Club except the right to vote, hold office, propose or endorse new members, or represent the Club officially. When the quota of Active members has been reached, the names of the elected candidates for membership, not to exceed twenty-five in number, shall be placed on the Waiting List and posted on the bulletin board of the Club.

Sec. 2. A candidate for membership must have been a resident of the community for at least six months and must be personally acceptable to the Board.

Application Forms Sec. 3. The name of a candidate for membership must be proposed by one member of the Club and endorsed by one other member. Applications for Membership may be secured from the Office. The Application for Membership must include the candidate's full name, address, and a Statement of the candidate's qualifications. The proposal and endorsement letters of recommendation for membership shall be included with the same Application for Membership. The proposer and endorser shall affix their signatures to their recommendations. The proposer and endorser must have been a member of the Club for at least six months unless they have been elected to membership from the Younger Woman's Club, in which case they shall be eligible immediately to propose and endorse candidates for membership. After a candidate has been introduced to the membership, the proposer and endorser shall be free to inform the candidate that membership is by invitation only.

No member of the candidate's family may propose her.

No candidate may be proposed or endorsed by more than one person in the same family.

During the Club year June through May, a member may propose four (4) successful candidates and endorse (4) four successful candidates. This provision shall apply equally to members of the Board; but while a candidate proposed or endorsed by a member of the Board is being considered, that member shall absent herself from the meeting.

Sec. 4. The Application for Membership must be enclosed in a sealed envelope marked "membership application" and sent to the President at The Woman's Club, 1320 South Fourth Street, Louisville, KY 40208. The President shall transmit the envelope, sealed, to the Committee on Membership. The Committee on Membership shall send its recommendation on proposed candidates for membership to the President in writing. The Board of Directors shall vote on candidates for membership by ballot.

Election of Members No candidate may be elected to membership who has not met at least two members of the Board.

A candidate receiving three votes in the negative shall fail of election.

No candidate who shall fail election shall be proposed again until

after the expiration of one year from the first proposal.

A person who has declined membership in the Club may be again considered by the Board provided that the application for membership be made by her in writing to the President within a period of five years. After five years it will be necessary for her to be proposed and endorsed as any other candidate for membership.

The President shall inform the Committee on Membership of any candidate for membership who fails of election to membership or who declines to accept membership.

Sec. 5. Every member of the Committee on Membership, every member of the Board, and the proposer and endorsers shall be honor bound to keep confidential the name of any person proposed for membership until the same shall have been finally passed on. In no event shall the name of a defeated candidate ever be known outside the proposer and endorsers, the Committee on Membership, and the Board of Directors. No member of the Committee on Membership and no member of the Board shall be at Liberty to state she voted.

Sec. 6. Immediate graduates of the Younger Woman's Club, eligible to membership in The Woman's Club, shall be recommended by the Board of The Younger Woman's Club and then presented, together with full identification and qualifications, to the President of The Woman's Club, who will present same to the Committee on Membership for action. The Committee on Membership shall send its recommendations on the proposed candidates for membership from The Younger Woman's Club to the President in writing. The Board of Directors shall vote on the candidates for membership by ballot. The vote shall be according to the procedure for Election of Members.

ARTICLE VII
FEES AND DUES

Sec. 1. Upon acceptance of membership, an initiation fee of \$250.00 shall be paid to The Woman's Club. Newly elected members who accept the invitation for membership between January 1 and May 31 shall not be required to pay their Active Dues until the following calendar year on June 1.

Initiation Fee

No initiation fee shall be required of a member of the Younger Woman's Club who has been elected to membership in The Woman's Club, and once so elected, she shall be eligible to join at any time upon written letter to the President of The Woman's Club and payment of Active Dues within 60 days of receipt of her written acceptance from The Woman's Club of Louisville. In the event she is accepted into membership between January 1 and May 31, she shall pay her Active dues by June 1st of the current calendar year.

Sec. 2. Annual Dues of Active members shall be \$250.00, payable in full by June 1. Annual dues of Associate members shall be \$180.00, payable in full by June 1. Associate members who resume Active membership during the Club year shall pay additional dues in the amount of difference between Associate dues and Active dues.

Annual Dues

Annual dues of Nonresident members shall be \$125.00, payable in full by June 1.

Annual dues of Special members shall be \$25.00, payable in full by

June 1.

Honorary and Fifty-Year members shall be exempt from all dues.

The *Yearbook* and *The Bulletin* will not be available to members until their dues are paid in full.

Sec. 3. A newly elected member must reply to the notification of her election and must pay to the Treasurer her initiation fee before the expiration of sixty days or said election will be declared forfeited.

Sec. 4. Members who have not paid their dues by July 1 shall be notified that unless they pay their dues by September 1, they shall be dropped from membership.

ARTICLE VIII

RESIGNATIONS AND REINSTATEMENTS

Sec. 1. The resignation of a member shall be accepted without requiring payment of current dues if it is submitted in writing before July 1. After July 1, the resignation of a member shall not be accepted until the dues have been paid in full for the year in which the resignation is presented in writing.

Sec. 2. A member who has resigned and wishes to be reinstated must state her wish in writing to the President who shall forward the former member's name and information to the Committee on Membership. The Committee on Membership shall send its recommendation on the former member seeking reinstatement to the President in writing. The vote shall be according to the Election of Members. Upon being reinstated, she shall pay a reinstatement fee of \$100.00 in addition to current Active dues within thirty days of notification of reinstatement. In the event she is reinstated between January 1 and May 31, she shall pay her Active dues by June 1st of the current calendar year.

Sec. 3. A person whose membership has been forfeited for nonpayment of dues may be reinstated at the discretion of the Board of Directors. This action must be recommended by the Committee on Membership after careful investigation and consideration. Upon reinstatement she shall pay the usual initiation fee within thirty days of notification of reinstatement.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELECTION TO OFFICE

Sec. 1. An election by ballot shall be held on the second Wednesday in December of each year. It shall be for the purpose of electing officers of the Club, the Chairman of the Council on Finance, and the Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections in accordance with provisions in Section 2 of this Article. No person shall be eligible to be elected to the office of President, First Vice- President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President or Chairman of the Council on Finance unless she has served a minimum of two years on the Board of Directors.

Nomination of
Candidates for
Office

Sec. 2. The term of office for each member of the Board of Directors shall be two years with the exception of the Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections, whose term shall be one year. The President, the Second Vice President, the Corresponding Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Chairmen of the Committees on American and Foreign Affairs, Art, Drama, and Health shall be elected in the even calendar years. The First Vice President, the Third Vice President, the Recording Secretary, the Chairman of the Council on Finance, and the Chairmen of the Committees on Community Service, Culinary Arts, Gardens, Hospitality, Literature, Music, and Special Interests shall be elected in the odd calendar years.

Sec. 3. The Committee on Nominations and Elections shall be elected in the following manner:

The Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections shall be elected at the Annual Election.

At its regular meeting in June, the Board of Directors shall elect one of its members to serve for one year as Vice Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections and another to serve as her alternate.

Prior to July 12 each committee of the Club and the Council on Finance shall elect by ballot one of its members and two alternates to serve on the Committee on Nominations and Elections for one year. Board members shall be ineligible. If there is only one candidate for any of the positions, election may be made by voice.

Members of the Committee on Nominations and Elections who have participated in the nomination of the slate shall be ineligible to serve on that committee for two years following such service.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of the Committee on Nominations and Elections to nominate two qualified candidates for each office to be filled that year and for the chairmanship of the Committee on Nominations and Elections. It shall be the privilege of all Active, Honorary, and Fifty-Year members of the Club to submit to the Committee on Nominations and Elections the names of possible candidates. In the event the Committee cannot obtain two qualified candidates, a nominee may run unopposed. It shall be the duty of the committee to obtain the consent of nominees to serve if elected.

Sec. 5. Prior to September each committee electing a chairman that year shall elect the chairman at the committee's summer business meeting. It shall be the duty of the chairman of the committee to submit the name of the newly elected chairman immediately to the Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections for inclusion in the report of the Committee on Nominations and Elections.

Sec. 6. The report of the Committee on Nominations and Elections shall be submitted to the President, and a copy shall be posted on the bulletin board of the Club no later than the second Wednesday in November, where it shall remain until after the election.

Sec. 7. The Annual Election shall be held on the second Wednesday in December between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Cancellation of the regular meeting on that day shall not postpone the election.

Members of the Committee on Nominations and Elections shall serve as election officers.

Ballots shall be printed in the December issue of *The Bulletin*.

Only Active, Honorary, and Fifty-Year members with Active member privileges shall be eligible to vote.

All such members shall be entitled to vote for all officers, for the Chairman of the Council on Finance, and for the Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections. Members shall have the privilege of writing in names on the ballot for all officers, for the Chairman of the Council on Finance, and for the Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections.

Ballots may be cast by members in person or sent to the Clubhouse. Before casting her ballot in person, each voter shall sign her name in a registration book. Ballots sent to the Clubhouse will be accepted if they are received before the polls close. Ballots sent by mail shall not be counted unless they are in an envelope addressed to the Committee on Nominations and Elections of The Woman's Club and bearing the name and address of the sender so that the membership list can be checked. The ballot itself shall be enclosed in a sealed inner envelope with no identifying marks.

Sec. 8. Each member shall be entitled to only one vote for each office and for each chairmanship.

Sec. 9. A majority of the ballots cast shall be required to elect. In case of a tie between two candidates, the election shall be decided by lot between the two candidates.

The Chairman of the Committee on Nominations and Elections shall notify the President of the results of the election and the results shall be published in the next issue of *The Bulletin*. The President shall notify the candidates of their election or defeat.

Sec. 10. Detailed instructions for the Committee on Nominations and Elections shall be on file in the office.

Sec. 11. Newly elected officers, Chairman of the Council on Finance, and chairmen of the committees shall make plans for the ensuing year. With the exception of the Treasurer and the Chairman of the Council on Finance, they shall assume office at the conclusion of the Annual Meeting. The Treasurer and the Chairman of the Council on Finance shall assume office June 1.

ARTICLE X
MEETINGS

Board Meetings

Sec. 1. The Board of Directors shall meet once a month on a day to be selected by the Board.

Club Meetings

The President may call special meetings of the Board and shall call them upon the request of the Executive Committee.

In the event the Club is closed due to a nation, state or city crisis, any event, program, or meeting may be held by technology.

Sec. 2. Regular meetings of the Club shall be held on Wednesday with the specific dates of the Club Calendar to be determined annually by the Board of Directors. The first meeting shall be held after September 1 and the last meeting no later than May 30. In case of an emergency, any meeting may be cancelled by the President upon the advice of the Executive Committee.

Sec. 3. The regular business meetings shall be the first and last regular meetings of the Club year.

Sec. 4. The last business meeting shall be designated the Annual Meeting of the Club.

Sec. 5. The President may, with the approval of the Board of Directors, call special meetings, and she shall call them upon the written request of thirty-five members. The purpose of any such meeting shall be stated in the call. Except in cases of emergency, notice of such meetings shall be mailed to members no later than seven days in advance. In emergencies, determined as such by the Board of Directors, notice shall be by telephone or electronically, and the requirement for advance notice shall not hold.

Sec. 6. Social meetings may be held at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Sec. 7. All regular Club meetings are open to Club members free of charge.

Sec. 8. The President, at the direction of the Board of Directors, shall invite to business meetings guests whose attendance is pertinent to the business to be transacted.

Guests

Admission fees to Club programs and number of guest tickets issued to each member shall be decided upon by the Board.

The number of times that nonmember residents of the community may be luncheon guests of the Club shall be determined annually by the Board of Directors and stated in the policies.

ARTICLE XI
FISCAL YEAR

Fiscal Year

The Club's fiscal year shall be June 1 through May 31.

ARTICLE XII
ENDORSEMENT AND PUBLICITY

Sec. 1. The Club may vote on the endorsement of proposed legislation or other matters of public interest only at business or called meetings, if members have been notified previously, otherwise than through the press, that the question will be considered at that meeting. If practicable, the Club, before voting shall hear both sides of the question presented.

Sec. 2. The vote of the minority shall be recorded and stated whenever publicity is given to the Club's action.

ARTICLE XIII
AUTHORITY FOR CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS

Sec. 1. In addition to any of the other activities outlined in these Bylaws, the Board of Directors may upon its own Resolution establish a charitable organization for the purpose of carrying out projects of a charitable nature in the community.

Sec. 2. The charitable organization established under this Article shall be entirely separate, apart, and distinct from any other group or committee, and all funds accruing to said group shall be used for no other purpose than charities selected by said group.

Sec. 3. The charitable organization established under this Article shall have the power to adopt its own Constitution or Articles of Incorporation or Articles of Association and/or Bylaws to govern its functions.

Sec. 4. The Club shall have the power to make contracts for the purpose of raising funds to be turned over to the organization established under this Article.

ARTICLE XIV QUORUMS

Thirty-five members shall constitute a quorum of the Club. Nine members shall constitute a quorum of the Board of Directors and Council on Finance. Five members shall constitute a quorum of each committee.

ARTICLE XV SUSPENSION AND AMENDMENT

If necessary, in order to facilitate routine business, these Bylaws may be suspended by unanimous vote of those present.

Any member may offer suggested changes in the Bylaws to the Committee on Bylaws. Such suggestions shall be submitted in writing by February 15 or by June 15. Proposed amendments to the Bylaws shall be presented by the Committee on Bylaws first to the Board for consideration and recommendations and then to the Club for action. Proposed changes in the Bylaws may also originate in the Committee on Bylaws.

The Board's recommendation for or against adoption shall be included in the advance notice.

If notice is given at least ten days in advance, these Bylaws may be amended at any business meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the qualified voting members that are present and voting, a quorum being present.

ARTICLE XVI MANUAL OF PROCEDURE

Deliberations of the meetings of the Club shall be governed by *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised*.

RESOLVED, that the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation of The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund, Inc. (the "Corporation"), revised as discussed at the Corporation's December 12, 2016 meeting of the Board of Directors and attached hereto at Exhibit A, are hereby approved and adopted, and the Corporation's officers are authorized and directed to execute the same and to take such actions (including without limitation filing the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation with the Kentucky Secretary of State) as are necessary to reflect adoption of the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation in the form attached.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Amended and Restated Bylaws of the Corporation, revised as discussed at the Corporation's December 12, 2016 meeting of the Board of Directors and attached hereto at Exhibit B, are hereby approved and adopted, and the Corporation's officers are authorized and directed to execute the same and to take such actions as are necessary to reflect adoption of the Amended and Restated Bylaws by the Corporation in the form attached, subject to such changes thereto as may be required by counsel and approved by the officer executing the same.

**AMENDED AND RESTATED
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund, Inc.**

The undersigned nonprofit corporation hereby amends and restates its Articles of Incorporation pursuant to the provisions of KRS 273.267 and 273.273 of the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Acts (the "Act") and states as follows:

- A. The names of the corporation is and will remain The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund, Inc.
- B. The purpose or purposes which the corporation is authorized to pursue are set forth in Article II below.
- C. These Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation of the corporation amend and restate in their entirety all of the provisions of the corporation's Articles of Incorporations, as previously filed on May 18, 1967, and correctly set forth the provisions thereof as amended by these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation were duly adopted as required by law and they supersede the original Articles of Incorporation.
- D. These Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation were duly adopted by the requisite vote of the Board of Directors of the corporations by resolution adopted at a meeting on December 12, 2016.
- E. The text of the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation, which shall amend, restate, replace and supersede all of the provisions of the original Articles of Incorporation, in its entirety, is as follows:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund, Inc.

ARTICLE II
PURPOSES, POWERS AND PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

1. PURPOSES. The Corporation is a Kentucky nonprofit corporation organized and operated exclusively for the following charitable purposes as may qualify it for exemption from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States internal revenue law (the “code”), and the Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder (the “regulations”), and as may qualify contributions to it for deduction under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder:

(a) The primary purposes of the Corporation are:

(i) To provide financial assistance to selected charitable or education organizations which are exempt from Federal income tax;

(ii) To provide support for the perpetual care, maintenance and preservations of historic real and tangible properties and facilities associated with The Woman’s Club of Louisville and located in the City of Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky;

(iii) To acquire, hold, sell, dispose of, pledge or mortgage any property it may acquire, tangible, intangible, real or personal as its purposes may require, subject to any limitations prescribed by law or by these Articles of Incorporation;

(iv) To accept gifts and carry out any terms, requests or conditions prescribed or made by the donor thereof which are not in conflict with Section 501(c)3 of the Code; and

(v) To do any and all lawful acts that may be necessary, useful, suitable or proper for the furtherance or accomplishment of the foregoing purposes of the Corporation.

2. POWERS. Except as otherwise provided in these Articles of Incorporation, the Corporation shall have, hold, enjoy and exercise any and all rights, privileges and powers vested in or conferred upon a corporation organized under the Act, including without limitation, the powers enumerated in KRS 273.171.

3. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES.

(a) No part of the Corporation’s net earnings shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its Directors, officers, or other private persons, except that this Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services actually rendered (except to Members of the Woman’s Club of Louisville) and to make payments and distributions including payments and distributions to the Member, defined below, if such payments and distributions further the purposes set forth in Section 1 hereof.

(b) The Corporation shall not in any manner or to any extent participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office, nor shall more than any insubstantial part of its activities consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.

(c) The Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities prohibited from being conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, and the Regulations promulgated thereunder,

or by a Corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code.

(d) The Corporation shall not be operated for the primary purpose of carrying on an unrelated trade or business as defined in Section 513 of the Code.

(e) The Corporation shall not make loans to any of its Directors or officers.

(f) Any other provision of these Articles to the contrary notwithstanding, this Corporation shall, if the following provisions of law are applicable to it:

(i) not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941 of the Code; (ii) distribute its income for each fiscal year at such time and in such manner as not to be subject to the tax under Section 4942 of the Code; (iii) not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943 of the Code; (iv) not make any investments in such manner as to subject the Corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code; and (v) not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945 of the Code.

ARTICLE III DURATION

The Corporation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

1. DESIGNATION OF SOLE MEMBER. The Corporation shall have one (1) member, which shall be The Woman's Club of Louisville, a Kentucky nonprofit corporation (the "Member"). The Member must at all times be an organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) or Section 501(c)(4) of the Code or be described in Section 170(c)(1) of the Code.

2. RESERVED POWERS OF SOLE MEMBER. Pursuant to the Act and subject to the limitations of the Act and any other applicable law or regulation, the Member shall have such powers and voting rights as are set forth in the Corporation's bylaws (the "Bylaws").

ARTICLE V DIRECTORS

Except as otherwise provided in these Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws, the affairs of the Corporation shall be managed under the direction of a Board of Directors consisting of not less than five (5) Directors, with the exact number to be established in such manner as is provided in the Bylaws.

The term of office, election process and the qualifications or criteria for the office shall be as provided in the Bylaws; however, notwithstanding any contrary provision in the Bylaws, any Director may be removed, with or without cause, at any time, by written notice of the Member. Upon such removal, the resulting vacancy shall be filled by written designation of the Member and shall take effect as of the effective date stated in such designation.

ARTICLE VI DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS ON DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, after paying or making provision for payment of all the liabilities and obligations of the Corporation, the remaining

assets of the Corporation shall be distributed as the Board of Directors of the Corporation, in its discretion, shall determine to: (a) such organization(s) that are organized and operated exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific or education purposes and are then qualified as organization(s) exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, and provide services in Jefferson County, Kentucky and/or contiguous counties; or (b) the Member, or its successor in interest, if then in existence and if qualified as an organization exempt from Federal income tax under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction in the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, testing for public safety, literary or educational purposes as described under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes and which have been determined to be exempt from Federal income tax under the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the code.

ARTICLE VII PERSONAL LIABILITY OF DIRECTORS

Except as provide below, no Director shall be personally liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for breach of her duties as a Director except for liability:

(a) for any transaction in which the Director's personal financial interest is in conflict with the financial interests of the Corporation; (b) for acts or omissions not in good faith or which involve intentional misconduct or are known to the Director to be a violation of law; or (c) for any transaction from which the Director derives an improper personal benefit. In addition, any action taken as a Director, or any failure to take any action as a Director, shall not be the basis for monetary damages or injunctive relief unless: (a) the Director breaches or fails to perform the duties of the Director's office in compliance with KRS 273.215; and (b) the breach or failure to perform, in the case of an action for monetary damages, constitutes willful misconduct or wanton or reckless disregard for human rights, safety or property.

If the Kentucky Revised Statues are amended after approval of the Article to authorize corporate action further eliminating or limiting the personal liability of Directors, then the liability of a Director of the Corporation shall be deemed to be eliminated or limited by this provision to the fullest extent then permitted by the Kentucky Revised Statues, as so amended. Any repeal or modification of the Article shall not adversely affect any right or protection of a Director of the Corporation existing at the time of such repeal or modification.

ARTICLE VIII AMENDMENTS

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended or repealed by a majority vote of the members of the Board of Directors; provided, however, that no corporate action purporting to amend, alter, change or repeal the Articles of Incorporation shall be effective unless that action is approved and adopted, in writing, by the Member, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld. The Member may withhold approval in its sole discretion if the action purports to amend, alter, change or repeal the Articles

of Incorporation in a way that would alter the Member's right hereunder. No amendment shall be adopted if such amendment would have the effect of disqualifying the Corporation as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or would have the effect of disqualifying contributions to the Corporation for deduction under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code.

ARTICLE IX
EFFECTIVE DATE

These Amended and Restated Articles of shall be effective on the date they are received by the Kentucky Secretary of State.

The undersigned corporation has caused these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation to be signed by a duly authorized officer, who declares under penalty of perjury under the law of Kentucky that the foregoing is true and correct.

BYLAWS

of

The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund, Inc.

ARTICLE I

NAME AND OFFICES

1. **CORPORATE NAME.** The corporation's name shall be The Woman's Club of Louisville Charity Fund, Inc. (the "Corporation"), a Kentucky nonprofit corporation organized pursuant to the Kentucky Nonprofit Corporation Acts, as amended (KRS 273.161 et seq.) (the "Act").

2. **CORPORATE OFFICES.** The Corporation shall have and continuously maintain a registered office in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and a registered agent whose office address is identical with such registered office. The Corporation shall have a principal office at such place as shall be designated by the Board of Directors of the Corporation (the "Board") within or without the Commonwealth of Kentucky as the Board may from time to time determine.

3. **CORPORATE PURPOSES.** The purposes for which the Corporation is formed, the business and objects to be carried on and promoted by it, and the powers granted to it, are set forth in the Corporation's Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation (the "Articles"). The Corporation's activities shall be consistent with the Member's vision and mission for the Corporation and with best practices.

4. **RESTRICTIONS ON PURPOSE AND ACTIVITIES.** Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Bylaws (the "Bylaws") to the contrary, the restrictions set forth in the Articles shall apply to the purposes, operations and activities of the Corporation.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERS

1. **MEMBER.** As provided in the Articles, the Corporation shall have one member, which shall be The Woman's Club of Louisville, a Kentucky nonprofit corporation (the "Member"). No other person or entity shall become a member of the Corporation except with the consent of the Board and the Member; provided, however, that any successor in interest to the Member, whether by reason of merger, consolidation or reorganization, shall be the Member of the Corporation provided that such successor is qualified as an organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended (the "Code"). The Member shall be considered the sole voting member for all purposes of the Act.

2. **MEMBER RESERVED POWERS.** The Member shall have the powers specified below with respect to the following matters, subject to any notices or further approvals required by applicable law, or by the Member's Bylaws:

(a) **Articles.** Approve amendment or repeal of the Corporation's Articles.

(b) **Bylaws.** Approve amendment or repeal of these Bylaws.

(c) **Directors.** Determine the number of, and appoint and remove, all Directors (as defined below) of the Corporation.

(d) Committees. Determine the number of, and appoint and remove, all committee members to the Corporation's standing committees.

(e) Significant Transactions. Approve all significant transactions involving the Corporation including, without limitation, (a) the adoption of any plan of merger or consolidation with another organization; (b) the sale, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge or other disposition of all, or substantially all, the property and assets of the Corporation; (c) the voluntary dissolution of the Corporation or revoking dissolution proceedings; and (d) the distribution of the assets of the Corporation.

(f) Budgets. Approve, acting through the Member's Council on Finance, capital and operating budgets, and long-term capital equipment plans for the Corporation.

(g) Unbudgeted Expenditures. Approve, acting through the Member's Council on Finance, unbudgeted expenditures in excess of a limit established by the Member, which limit may be revised from time to time.

(h) Real Property Transactions. Approve any borrowing or significant incurrence of debt by the Corporation, or any sale, purchase, alienation, exchange, significant leases (other than in the ordinary course) or encumbrances of the Corporation's real property, if any, except those made pursuant to approved budgets.

(i) Material Contracts. Approve any material contract, as defined from time to time by the Member, for the Corporation including without limitation management contracts, deeds, mortgages, etc.

(j) Significant Unbudgeted Transactions. Approve, acting through the Member's Council on Finance, any other significant and unbudgeted sale, purchase, exchange, lease (other than in the ordinary course), transfer, litigation or legal settlement, benefits packages, encumbrance or other disposition or other significant transaction involving the non-real-estate assets of the Corporation in excess of a limit established by the Member, which limit may be revised from time to time.

(k) Material Changes in Activities. Approve any change in the fundamental nature of the Corporation's activities or any material change in the kinds of activities or services it renders, including without limitation joint venture relationships, unrelated business activities, the creation of any affiliate to be owned or controlled by the Corporation, or any voluntary change to the Corporation's status as an organization exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

(m) Business Name, Logo. Approve any selection or modification of the business name or logo of the Corporation (or any program of the Corporation), or the use of any corporate or business name of the Corporation by an entity other than the Member.

(n) Contribution Acceptance. Approve acceptance of a contribution that imposes a material obligation on the Corporation, if approved by the Corporation as consistent with the Corporation's and Member's mission and goals.

Where this Article II, Section 2 reserves rights to the Member's Council on Finance, the Council will exercise such rights subject to approval by the Member's Board of Directors.

The services of auditors, grant writers, fundraisers, bankers, financial advisors, and attorneys will be provided for by the same auditors, grant writers, fundraisers, bankers, financial advisors and attorneys (subject to attorney ethical rules regarding conflict of interest, if any) who provide services to the Member, unless the Member approves otherwise.

3. ANNUAL MEETING. The annual meeting of the Member, for the purpose of appointing individuals to serve on the Corporation's Board and transacting such other business as shall properly come before the Member, shall be held on the same date as the annual meeting of the Board, at such time and place as shall be designated by the Member.

4. SPECIAL MEETINGS. Special meetings of the Member may be called at any time by resolution of the Board of Directors of the Corporation, by the Member, by the President of the Member, or by such other person or persons in accordance with applicable law.

5. PLACE OF MEETINGS. The place of meeting for any annual or special meeting shall be designated by the Board or the person calling such meeting. In the absence of a designation, the meeting shall be held at the principal office of the Corporation.

6. MANNER OF ACTING. The Member shall act as it so determines, including through resolution of the Member's Council on Finance, resolution of the Member's Board of Directors, or approval by specified officers of the Member. Actions by the Member shall be appropriately documented in the Member's records and communicated by the Member to the Corporation's officers.

ARTICLE III BOARD OF DIRECTORS

1. GENERAL POWERS. The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed under the direction of the Board, subject to the powers reserved to the Member in Article II of these Bylaws. In fulfilling its duties, the Board will work to assure that the Corporation's activities are performed in a manner that furthers the Member's mission and values for the Corporation, consistent with the Corporation's Articles and these Bylaws.

2. NUMBER, ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE. Consistent with Article V of the Articles, the Board shall consist of not less than five (5) members, the exact number to be set according to these Bylaws. Unless and until changed by the Member, the Board shall be composed of thirteen (13) voting directors, including three (3) ex officio, voting directors (each a "Director" and collectively the "Directors").

(a) Ex officio Directors. The President of the Member, the immediate Past President of the Member, and the Chair of the Member's Council on Finance shall serve as ex officio voting members of the Board. Such ex officio Directors shall hold office as members of the Board only for so long as they hold office on behalf of the Member. In addition, the Member's Parliamentarian shall also serve on the Board, ex officio, but without voting rights.

(b) Other Directors. The remaining Directors of the Corporation shall be members of The Woman's Club of Louisville as selected by the Member.

(c) **Staggered Terms.** Except for ex officio Directors, Directors shall be classified according to the time for which they shall severally hold office by dividing them into three (3) groups, with the number in each group to be as even as possible. Except as otherwise provided herein, the terms of office of all of the Directors in each group shall expire at the same time. The terms of office held by Directors in each group shall be staggered so that the terms of office of the Directors of only one group shall expire each year.

(d) **Maximum Consecutive Terms.** A maximum of three (3) consecutive two-year terms of office may be served by any Director. The periods during which a Director completes the remainder of another Director's term or during which a Director serves ex officio shall not be considered in calculating the maximum consecutive terms. Each Director's remaining term as of the effective date of these Bylaws shall be set forth in a resolution of the Board adopted at the time that these Bylaws are approved. Directors are eligible for reelection to the Board after at least a one-year absence. Any term served by a Director that is less than three (3) years in length for any reason shall not constitute a term for purposes of this Article III, Section 2.

Notwithstanding any other provision in these Bylaws, absent death, resignation, disqualification or removal, a Director's term shall not expire until a successor has been appointed, as the case may be, and has qualified for office.

3. RESIGNATION AND REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS; VACANCIES. Any Director may resign at any time by giving written notice to the President or Secretary. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein. As provided in Article II of these Bylaws, any Director may be removed by the Member for cause, as determined by the Member's Board of Directors in its reasonable discretion. Any Director who is absent from three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board, without seeking approval from the President, shall be deemed to have resigned as a Director. Any Director who resigns from, or becomes ineligible for membership in, The Woman's Club of Louisville shall be deemed to have resigned as a Director of the Corporation. When vacancies on the Board occur by reason of death, resignation, removal or otherwise, the number of Board seats shall be deemed reduced by such vacancies (but not to less than the minimum number specified in Article VII of the Articles) until qualified replacements are appointed by the Member for the unexpired term consistent with the requirements of Article III, Section 2 above.

4. ANNUAL MEETING. Unless otherwise approved by the Board, the Board shall conduct an annual meeting to be held at such date, time and location as so designated by the President, by a majority of the Board, or by the Member.

5. REGULAR MEETINGS. The Board shall conduct regular meetings with such frequency as the Board deems necessary to properly manage the business and affairs of the Corporation. The date, time and location of the Board's regular meetings shall be determined by the President after consultation with the Board and staff.

6. SPECIAL MEETING. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President or by a majority of the Board. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board shall set the date, time and location of such meeting.

7. MEETING NOTICE. Notice of any meeting shall be given at least two (2) calendar days before the meeting. Notice may be given by written notice delivered personally or by wire or wireless communication, including facsimile and e-mail, to each Director at her address listed in the Corporation's records. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail in a sealed envelope so addressed, with sufficient postage paid. If notice is provided by wire or wireless communication, including facsimile or e-mail, notice shall be deemed to be delivered upon its transmission. Any Director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, unless the Director at the beginning of the meeting (or promptly upon her arrival) objects to the transaction of any business at the meeting and does not thereafter vote for or assent to action taken at the meeting. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.

8. QUORUM AND MANNER OF ACTION. A majority of the Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board. If less than a majority of the Directors are present at any meeting, a majority of the Directors present may adjourn the meeting without further notice. The act of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board, unless the act of a greater number is required by law or by these Bylaws. Directors may not vote by proxy.

9. INFORMAL ACTION OF BOARD. Unless otherwise provided by law, any action required to be taken at a meeting of the Board, or any other action which may be taken at a meeting of the Board, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action to be taken and the timing for when such action will become effective, shall be executed by all of the Directors entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter. Such consent shall have the same effect as a unanimous vote.

10. MEETING PARTICIPATION BY TELEPHONE OR SIMILAR COMMUNICATION. Directors may participate in a meeting by means of conference telephone or other similar communications equipment by which all Directors participating in such meeting can communicate with each other, and participation in such meeting shall constitute presence in person by such Directors at such meeting.

11. COMPENSATION. No Director shall receive compensation for her services as a Director; provided however that, subject to approval by the Member and to any policy or limitation applied by the Member to the Corporation's Board, Directors may be reimbursed for their out-of-pocket expenses incurred solely by reason of their duties or responsibilities as Board members. While a Director may not serve the Corporation as an employee, she may serve the Corporation in an independent contractor capacity and receive reasonable compensation for services provided.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

1. OFFICERS; ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE. The Corporation shall have the following officers: a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such

other officers as the Board may from time to time elect. The President shall be the President of the Member. Except for the President, the Board will elect officers from among its membership at its annual meeting. An elected officer shall serve for a two-year term, subject to a maximum of two (2) successive full terms, or until her successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified or until her death or until she resigns or is removed in the manner provided below.

2. **PRESIDENT.** The President shall preside at all Board meetings and shall be an ex officio member of all committees of the Board and all subcommittees without vote. The President shall carry out such other duties as are assigned to her pursuant to these Bylaws or by the Board. Unless otherwise ordered by the Board, the President will have full power and authority on behalf of the Corporation to attend, act and vote at any meetings of shareholders of any corporation in which the Corporation may hold stock, and at any such meeting shall hold and may exercise all rights incident to the ownership of such stock which the Corporation, as owner, would have had and exercised if present.

3. **SECRETARY.** The Secretary shall be responsible for sending appropriate notices, preparing agendas for meetings of the Board, preparing minutes for meetings of the Board, its standing committees and the Member, and maintaining and authenticating records and reports of the Corporation. So long as they are carried out, the Secretary may delegate one or more of these functions to other Board members or to employees of the Member.

4. **TREASURER.** The Treasurer shall (a) maintain the Corporation's financial books and records and oversee the Corporation's financial affairs, and (b) in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to her by the President or by the Board. The Treasurer shall be required to give bond in such sum as the Member's Council on Finance shall decide, the Member's Board of Directors concurring. The bonds shall be executed by a responsible guaranty company, and the expense shall be paid by the Corporation.

5. **REMOVAL AND RESIGNATION.** Any officer of the Corporation may be removed by the Member with or without cause and without a hearing. Election or appointment of an officer shall not of itself create contract rights. Any officer of the Corporation may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Corporation's President or Secretary, and unless otherwise specified in the written notice, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. If the Member removes the President, or if the President resigns from her office, then the President will also have been removed or will have resigned from serving as President of the Member.

6. **VACANCIES.** Except for the President, a vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise may be filled by the Board for the unexpired portion of the term.

ARTICLE V COMMITTEES

1. **COMMITTEES.** The Board may designate one (1) or more special or standing committees, and may delegate to any such committee or committees any or all of the powers of the Board, except those which by law, the Articles, or

these Bylaws they are prohibited from delegating. The standing committees of the Board shall be the Charitable Giving Committee and the Preservation Committee and such other committees as the Board may establish by resolution from time to time. Except as the Board or these Bylaws may specifically delegate or authorize in particular instances, the authority of any committee shall be limited to advising the Board on matters referred to it. Each committee shall be subject to the ultimate control and direction of the Board. Unless the Board or these Bylaws otherwise designate, committees shall conduct their affairs in the same manner, to the extent possible, as provided by these Bylaws for the Directors.

(a) Charitable Giving Committee. The Charitable Giving Committee shall consist of at least five (5) members, the exact number to be determined by the Member. At least two (2) directors of the Corporation shall be members of the Charitable Giving Committee. The Charitable Giving Committee's members shall be elected by the Member. Its members shall include the following: (i) the Chair of the Small Charities Review Subcommittee; and (ii) a representative from the Member's Committee on Community Service. The Charitable Giving Committee shall develop and implement procedures for the receipt and review of grant applications, recommend grant awards (subject to approval by the Corporation's Board), and monitor and review the performance of grant recipients. The Charitable Giving Committee shall also be responsible for such other matters assigned to it by the Board or the President.

(b) Preservation Committee. The Preservation Committee shall consist of five (5) members, at least two (2) of whom are directors of the Corporation. The Preservation Committee's members shall be elected by the Member. Members of the Preservation Committee need not be members of the Corporation's Board. Its members shall be comprised of persons affiliated with educational organizations, professional architectural associations, and historical societies, with no more than two (2) of its members being members of The Woman's Club of Louisville. The Preservation Committee will be responsible for providing support for the perpetual care, maintenance and preservation of historic real and tangible properties and facilities associated with The Woman's Club of Louisville and located in the City of Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky (the "Buildings"). The Preservation Committee will be responsible for ensuring that the public has opportunities to engage with the Buildings. The Preservation Committee will also be responsible for soliciting support for the Corporation's preservation activities from the public by building a base of general support, fundraising, developing and maintaining relationships with donors or potential donors and grant writing.

2. **AUTHORITY AND MANNER OF ACTING.** Unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws or unless otherwise ordered by the Board, any committee shall act by a majority of its voting members at any meeting thereof or by a writing or writings signed by all of its voting members. No committee shall have or may exercise any power or authority that is not exercisable by the Board, including any power or authority over matters delegated by the Member to a committee of the Member. All standing committees shall prepare and file minutes of their meetings with the Secretary of the Corporation to be maintained with the records of the Corporation.

3. TERM. The term of appointment to a committee shall be at the discretion of the Board, but shall not exceed any committee member's term as a Board member.

4. VACANCIES. Vacancies in the membership of any committee may be filled by appointments made in the same manner as provided in the case of the original appointments.

5. SUBCOMMITTEES. Subject to the approval of the Board, committees of the Board may establish subcommittees to assist in the fulfillment of the purposes of the committees.

ARTICLE VI CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

1. STATEMENT OF GENERAL POLICY ON CONFLICT OF INTEREST. The Member, with the ratification of the Board, shall adopt a policy on conflicts of interest which is consistent with these Bylaws.

2. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST. All Directors or officers shall disclose all real or apparent conflicts of interest that come to their attention. No transactions involving remuneration or benefit to a Director or officer, or to an organization in which such Director or officer has a material financial interest or of which the Director or officer is a member, officer, director, general partner, principal or controlling stockholder, shall be entered into by the Corporation without (a) a full disclosure to the Board by the interested Director or officer of the material facts of the transaction and the Director's or officer's interest or relationship; (b) the authorization, approval or ratification of the non-interested Directors; and (c) a determination by the Board that the transaction is fair to the Corporation at the time it is authorized, approved or ratified. No Director so involved may vote on such authorization, approval or ratification by the Board.

3. DISCLOSURE. "Disclosure" as used herein shall mean (a) providing promptly to the President of the Board, or to such person or persons as otherwise directed by the President of the Board, a written description of the facts comprising the real or apparent conflict of interest, or (b) if the real or apparent conflict comes to such individual's attention in the course of a meeting of the Board, providing a verbal description of the facts comprising the real or apparent conflict of interest, which description shall be reflected in the minutes of such meeting. In addition, all Directors and officers shall complete a questionnaire annually relating to potential conflicts of interest, and those questionnaires shall remain on file.

4. GOOD FAITH AND IN CORPORATION'S BEST INTERESTS. Each member of the Board, when discharging the duties of a Director, shall act in good faith, and in a manner the Director reasonably believes to be in the best interests of the Corporation.

5. DUE CARE. Board or committee members, when becoming informed with their decision-making function or devoting attention to their oversight function, must discharge their duties with the care that a person in a like position would reasonably believe appropriate under similar circumstances.

6. REASONABLE RELIANCE ON OTHERS. In discharging her duties, a Director or officer may rely on the following persons, unless the Director or

officer has knowledge that makes such reliance unwarranted:

(a) Officers and Employees. One or more officers or employees of the Corporation or Member whom the Director or officer reasonably believes to be reliable and competent in the functions performed or information, opinions, reports, or statements provided;

(b) Outside Experts. Legal counsel, public accountants, or other persons retained by the Corporation or the Member as to matters involving skills or expertise the Director reasonably believes are matters: (i) within the particular person's professional or expert competence, or (ii) as to which the particular person merits confidence; and

(c) Board Committees. A committee of the Board of which the Director is not a member if the Director reasonably believes the committee's determinations merit confidence.

ARTICLE VII CONTRACTS AND FINANCES

1. CONTRACTS. Subject to the Member's approval rights described in Article II, Section 2, the Board may authorize any officer or officers of the Corporation or of the Member to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

2. CHECKS, DRAFTS, ORDERS, ETC. Subject to the Member's approval rights described in Article II, Section 2, all checks, drafts or orders of the Corporation in amounts less than \$500.00 shall be signed by the Treasurer, the Chair of the Member's Council on Finance, or by the President. Subject to the Member's approval rights described in Article II, Section 2, all checks, drafts or orders of the Corporation in amounts of \$500.00 or more shall be signed by two of the following: the President, the Chair of the Member's Council on Finance, the Treasurer or one other member of the Board of Directors authorized by the Board of Directors to be a cosignatory.

3. DEPOSITS; INVESTMENTS. Subject to the Member's approval rights described in Article II, Section 2, all funds of the Corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board may select. Separate accounts may be established by the Treasurer of the Corporation for the Charitable Giving Committee and the Preservation Committee. The Treasurer shall maintain records of all moneys in said accounts and of all receipts and disbursements arising out of the Corporation's operations. All funds of the Corporation available for investment shall be promptly invested in such manner as shall be approved generally or specifically by the Corporation's Board or by the Member's Board of Directors.

4. GIFTS. Subject to the Member's approval rights described in Article II, Section 2, the Board may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest, or devise for the general purposes or for any special purposes of the Corporation.

5. LOANS. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Corporation, and no evidence of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by the

Board and approved by the Member in accordance with Article II, Section 2 of these Bylaws. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. Consistent with the Articles, no loan shall be granted to an officer or Director of the Corporation. No loans shall be made to employees of the Charity Fund nor to employees or members of The Woman's Club of Louisville.

ARTICLE VIII BOOKS AND RECORDS

The Corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board and committees having any authority of the Board and records of the actions of the Member. Maintenance of the books and records by the Member on behalf of the Corporation shall satisfy the foregoing. All books and records of the Corporation may be inspected by the Member and any Director, or by their respective agent or attorney, for any purpose at any reasonable time.

ARTICLE IX FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin on the first day of June and end on the last day of May of each year.

ARTICLE X EXCULPATION AND INDEMNIFICATION

1. EXCULPATION. Consistent with Article VII of the Amended and Re- stated Articles of Incorporation, no Director shall be personally liable to the Corporation for monetary damages for breach of her duties as a Director to the extent permitted by the Act.

2. SCOPE OF INDEMNIFICATION. Subject to the terms of Article X, Section 1 of these Bylaws, any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (including any action by or in the right of the Corporation) by reason of the fact that she is or was serving as a Director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, member, manager, partner, trustee, employee or agent of another corporation, limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise, shall be indemnified and held harmless by the Corporation to the fullest extent authorized by the Act, as the same may be amended (but, in the case of any amendment, only to the extent that amendment permits the Corporation to provide broader indemnification rights than the law permitted prior to amendment) against loss, liability, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by her in connection with such action, suit or proceeding if she acted in good faith for a purpose which she reasonably believed to be in the best interest of the Corporation, and, in criminal actions or proceedings, she had no reasonable cause to believe that her conduct was unlawful, to the maximum

extent permitted by and in the manner provided by the Act. The Corporation shall indemnify a Director, officer, employee or agent who was wholly successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of any proceeding to which she was a party because she is or was a Director, officer, employee or agent of the Corporation against reasonable expenses incurred by her in connection with the proceeding. The right to indemnification hereunder shall continue for any Director, officer, employee or agent who has ceased to be a Director, officer, employee or agent.

3. AUTHORIZATION OF INDEMNIFICATION. The Corporation shall not authorize indemnification of a Director, officer, employee or agent until a determination has been made that such individual has met the standard of conduct to be entitled to indemnification under Article X, Section 2 in accordance with one of the following procedures:

(a) By majority vote of a quorum of the Board of Directors consisting of Directors not parties to the action, suit or proceeding for which indemnification is considered;

(b) If a quorum cannot be obtained under subparagraph (a) above, by majority vote of a committee duly designated by the Board of Directors (in which designation Directors who are parties may participate) consisting solely of two (2) or more Directors not at the time parties to the action, suit or proceeding for which indemnification is considered;

(c) By a determination made by independent special legal counsel selected by the Board of Directors or its committee in the manner set forth in sub-paragraph (a) or (b) above; or

(d) If a quorum of the Board cannot be obtained under subparagraph (a) and a committee cannot be designated under subparagraph (b), by a determination made by independent special legal counsel selected by majority vote of the full Board (in which selection Directors who are parties may participate).

4. ADVANCE FOR EXPENSES. The Corporation shall pay for or reimburse the reasonable expenses incurred by a Director, officer, employee or agent who is a party to a proceeding in advance of final disposition of the proceeding if: (1) the Director, officer, employee or agent furnishes the Corporation a written affirmation of her good faith belief that she has met the standard of conduct described in Article X, Section 2; (2) the Director, officer, employee or agent furnishes the Corporation a written undertaking, executed personally or on her behalf, to repay the advance if it is ultimately determined that she is not entitled to indemnification; and (3) a determination is made that the facts then known to those making the determination would not preclude indemnification under the Act. The undertaking required of the Director, officer, employee or agent must be an unlimited general obligation of the Director, officer, employee or agent, but may be unsecured and may be accepted without reference to financial ability to make repayment.

5. INSURANCE. The Corporation will purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person, who is or was an officer, Director, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as an officer, director, member, manager, partner, trustee, employee or agent of another corporation, limited liability company, partnership, joint venture, trust, employee benefit plan or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against her and

incurred by her in any such capacity, or arising out of her status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power or would be required to indemnify her against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XI WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provision of these Bylaws, or under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation, or under the provisions of applicable law, waiver thereof in writing, signed by the person, or persons, entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

ARTICLE XII AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended, altered, changed or repealed by a majority vote of the Board; provided, however, that no corporate action purporting to amend, alter, change or repeal the Bylaws shall be effective unless that action is approved and adopted, in writing, by the Member. The Member may withhold approval in its sole discretion if the action purports to amend, alter, change or repeal the Bylaws in a way that would alter the Member's rights hereunder. No amendment, alteration, change or repeal shall be adopted if it will have the effect of disqualifying the Corporation as a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code would have the effect of disqualifying contributions to the Corporation for a deduction under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code. Prior notice of a meeting called for such purpose shall be provided in accordance with the Act which notice shall (a) state that a purpose of the meeting is to consider a proposed amendment to the Bylaws; and (b) set forth a summary of the proposed amendment, alteration, change or repeal.
